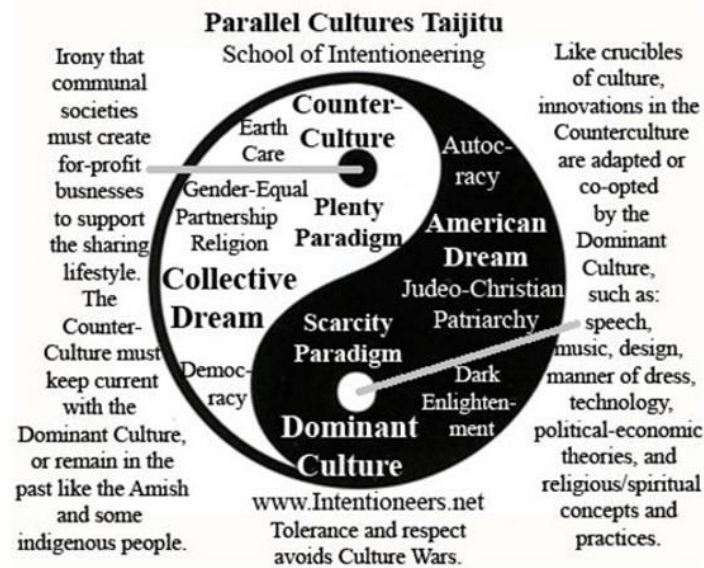
Antifa Allegory

People generally know more about the characters, places, and events of Middle-earth than they know about intentional community, so an allegory relating the people, places, and histories of real-world intentional communities to the high-fantasy of J. R. R. Tolkien's *Lord of the Rings* provides an entertaining way for people to learn about the range of different types of alternative lifestyles in existence and available.

The Antifa Allegory takes the theory of Dark Enlightenment, now influencing our national and state governments, which is based on the political-economic model of cameralism, and relates that theory to Tolkien's story of an evil force seeking to control all the races of Middle-earth. Cameralism is a form of pre-capitalist mercantilism developed in Prussia, formerly in northeast Europe from the 16th century to the first half of the 20th century. Cameralism is the monarchist-libertarian governing model preferred by the current President of the United States. **September, 2026.**
